Equal Opportunities Commission

- Equal Opportunities Commission is a statutory body set up in 1996.
- 4 Anti-Discrimination Ordinances are currently in force:
 1. Sex Discrimination Ordinance, 1996
 2. Disability Discrimination Ordinance, 1996
 3. Family Status Discrimination Ordinance, 1997
 4. Race Discrimination Ordinance, 2009

Funding Programme of Research Projects on Equal Opportunities 2017/18

- Preference will be given to projects on one or some of the following priority areas listed in the EOC's strategic workplan:
 1. Pursue with the Government on the EOC's Discrimination Law Review (DLR) and educate the public on the four anti-discrimination ordinances, including what the gaps are and gaining their support for the recommendations in the DLR and their views made known to the Government
 2. Advocate education and employment opportunities and access to public services for ethnic minorities
 3. Advocate education and employment opportunities and access to public services for persons with disabilities
 4. Foster a friendly environment free from discrimination and harassment

Eligibility

1. Established not-for-profit educational bodies
 2. Registered not-for-profit organizations
 3. Academics attached to universities and other degree-awarding institutions in Hong Kong
- With track record on equal opportunities related work
 - Eligibility proof is required
 - Joint application is allowed, but a principal organization must be identified and a Person-in-charge must be appointed.

Other Requirements

- Proposed research project should meet the objectives of the Funding Programme and not be of a fund-raising, profit-making, commercial, religious or political nature.
- The EOC will not fund any project which accepts sponsorship or any kind of financial support from a third party.
- Research projects which have been completed or in progress at the time of making the application will not be considered.
- All activities of the proposed research projects should be carried out in Hong Kong.
- All funded research projects must be carried out and completed within one year after commencement.

Application Procedures and Deadline of Application

- Deadline: 18 April 2017 (Tuesday) 5:00pm

- Applicants should deliver the following documents to the EOC Office by post or in person on or before the application deadline:
 - ✓ An original completed application form plus 2 duplicated copies
 - ✓ Documentary proof of eligibility to apply
 - ✓ Other relevant support documents, if any

- Completed application form and details of the proposed research projects in either English or Chinese are accepted.

Application Form, Research Proposal, Estimated Budget, etc.

- Application form is downloadable from EOC website
- Research proposal should include: title, objectives, research question(s), analytical framework, research design, time schedule, expected results, social impacts and deliverables
- Estimated budget should include: estimated expenditure of individual items and amount requested from the EOC for each individual item. (*Examples will be given ...*)
- Other relevant information (e.g. track record of related projects and publications, CV of the Person-in-charge, etc.)
- Max. 10 A4 pages

Assessment Criteria

- Approval of applications is based on the following criteria:
 1. Applicant's knowledge of the proposed research topic
 2. Innovation and social impact of the proposed research project
 3. Applicant's track record and experience in delivering research projects
 4. Qualifications of the applicant and the research team
 5. Applicant's capacity to engage and mobilize manpower or other types of resource to complete the proposed research project
 6. Cost-effectiveness of the proposed research project

Funding Limit Per Project

- Maximum amount: HK\$50,000
- HK\$100,000 in special cases with exceptional justifications

Deliverables

- A final report in either English or Chinese with an executive summary in bilingual (English and Chinese) format
- A presentation of the research findings in a press conference to be held at the EOC Office
- A mid-term progress report for research projects lasting more than 6 months
- A financial report
- All receipts of reimbursed expenses

Funding Procedures

- Funding will be administered by providing an advance of 50% of the approved fund for launching the research projects and residual 50% or balance of fund for completion.
- Funded organizations will normally be required to settle the approved budget expenditure on a reimbursement basis.
- Funds should be expended according to the approved itemized budget. If any of the itemized expenses exceed 10% of the original estimate, the organization concerned should submit an explanation to the EOC in writing, and request for advance approval from the EOC.

Guidelines for the Use of Funding:

Points to Note

- Funded organizations should adhere to the following procedures when **purchasing materials and services**
 - Obtain more than one quotation for an individual item which costs more than \$1,000 or service which costs more than \$6,000
 - Contact at least 3 vendors/contractors if an individual item costs more than \$10,000
 - Generally the organization should choose the lowest quotation

- **Overhead charges or administrative top up**
 - Not funded

- **Allowance for staff responsible for the research project**
 - Salary expenditure will not be subsidized
 - Consideration will be given to short-term or temporary workers employed on a one-off basis
 - No extra allowances will be provided for existing staff

2.	3 South Asian volunteers to answer enquires about questionnaire	\$12,000 (\$100 per day X 20 days X 3 volunteers)	\$12,000
3.	Translation fee of questionnaire into 6 South Asian languages	\$7,200 (120 hours (\$60 per hour X 20 hours X 6 part-time assistants))	\$7,200
4.	2 Part-time assistants to carry out coding and data input of the questionnaires	\$14,400 (240 hours (\$60 per hour X 40 hours X 3 months X 2 part-time assistants))	\$14,400
5.	6 workshops to introduce 4 anti-discrimination ordinances to South Asians		
	➤ Venue fee	\$6,000 (\$500 per hour X 2 hours X 6 workshops)	\$0
	➤ Promotion: design and printing of posters	\$1,000	\$1,000

- The copyright for the funded research projects should be shared between the funded organization and the EOC. When publication is made, the EOC as the funding organization should be acknowledged.
- The Person-in-charge of the research project should advise the EOC concerning any significant changes to the details of the funded research projects (including the change of Person-in-charge, the change of research design, the adjustment of sample size, the extension of the project duration, etc.) in writing.
