- The EOC received a total of 108 complaints in the last two months (from January to February 2007), representing an increase of 8 cases or 8% over the same period last year when 100 complaints were received.
- Complaints under the DDO accounted for the majority of the complaints received in the last two months:
 - 72 complaints received under the **DDO** (67%)
 - 31 complaints received under the **SDO** (29%)
 - 5 complaints received under the **FSDO** (4%)
- In the first two months of 2007, 72 complaints were received under the DDO, recording an increase of 28% over the same period last year when 56 complaints under the DDO were received.
- From January to February 2007, 31 complaints were received under the SDO, representing a decrease of 23% over the same period last year, when 40 such complaints were received. Most of the SDO complaints were related to pregnancy discrimination (15) and sexual harassment (8), compared to 10 and 12 respectively for the same period last year, showing an increase of 50% in pregnancy discrimination cases and a decrease of 33% in sexual harassment cases.

Enquiry figures:

- The total number of enquiries received in the last two months (January to February 2007) was 3,159. The figure for the same period last year was 1,931. An increase by 1,228 or 64% was recorded, attributed by an increase in the number of enquiries about sexual orientation discrimination.
