

"All Races as One" Learning Kit on Eliminating Racial Discrimination
Session 2 Group Discussion Worksheet

Key Message: A person's potential is not determined by race. Discrimination will only constrain the person from realising his/her potential.

Roles: Mr Gurung (Nepali parent)
Ms Lee (Receptionist)

Story: One day, Mr Gurung, a Nepali, went to ABC Kindergarten, where he would like his daughter to study, to enquire about school briefing sessions and admission applications.

Ms. Lee, the receptionist, pointed out that the briefing sessions will be conducted in Cantonese. Mr Gurung did not attend the briefing session and asked for an admission application form instead. Ms. Li pointed out that one of the assessments in the interview was to test the applicant's Chinese proficiency, and told him that it might be more appropriate to apply to an international kindergarten for his daughter.

1. Why do you think the protagonist wanted his daughter to study in a local mainstream kindergarten?

2. Why do you think the person-in-charge of applications has reservations about admitting non-Chinese students to the kindergarten?

3. What can the kindergarten principal do to improve admission criteria and other measures?
