





Prevalence of Workplace Sexual Harassment (Base=3,928)




Younger Women are More Vulnerable to Workplace Sexual Harassment


Younger women (aged 18-34) were almost twice as likely to be sexually harassed at work (22.5%), compared to 11.8% of the overall average.




Nature of Workplace Sexual Harassment



Sex of Harassers in Workplace (by sex of victims)




Most victims were harassed by men (66.7%). Regardless of the sex of the victims, a majority of both female and male victims were harassed by men. A quarter of male victims were harassed by women (25.9%). When the 56.2 % with is a % male % 15.8 % 11.7 When the victim is a female %



Many victims, male and female alike, were harassed by colleagues at the same rank (44.6%). But more female victims were sexually harassed by someone more senior in rank or powerful at work: 30.5% of female victims were harassed by employers/ supervisors/ senior colleagues and 15.9% by clients.

Witnesses to Workplace Sexual Harassment




Two in Five (41.4%) 41.4% of victims reported that someone had witnessed or had been confided the most recent incident of workplace sexual harassment.

Out of all victims of workplace sexual harassment, only 11.9% of the most recent incident was intervened or stopped by a third party.



Prevalence of Online Sexual Harassment (Base=4,698)



sexual harassment was the highest among younger women (aged 18-34), with a quarter of them being sexually harassed online (25.7%).

The Most Common Forms of Online Sexual Harassment Include:
