"If you file a complaint after 12 months, they may decide not to conduct an investigation, unless you have a justifiable reason."

Time Bar

If someone experiences sexual harassment and wants to file a complaint, they can approach the Equal Opportunities Commission (“EOC”) within 12 months of the incident. This time limit is designed to ensure that the complainant can recall all the necessary details accurately. However, if more than 12 months have elapsed since the occurrence, the EOC may choose not to investigate the complaint or to discontinue an ongoing investigation.
