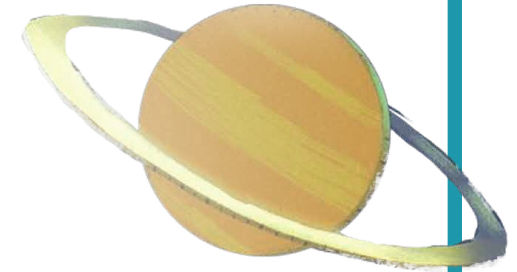




## Find the Mistakes

## Find the Mistakes (Job Advertisement) Teacher's Guidance

### Mistakes:

- We are looking for a **male** children's toy designer to join our team.
- **Physically strong, good-looking**
- **No need to take care of family**

The job advertisement specifies that the candidate must be male, physically strong, good-looking, and have no family responsibilities. These requirements involve biases based on gender, appearance, and family roles. However, these conditions are not relevant to the job of a children's toy designer.
