- 2. Who is mainly responsible for household chores at home? How are the tasks divided?
 - (Open-ended question)
- 3. As a family member, do you help with household chores? If so, what tasks do you help with?
 - (Open-ended question)
- 4. Have you heard of "family-friendly practices"? How can we support families with different needs in daily life?
 - Families with children, elderly members, or individuals with special needs may require additional support both at work and in daily life to help them provide care and alleviate the pressure they face.

For example, restaurants can implement family-friendly facilities and designs to enhance the dining experience for families with children. Examples include:

- Providing child-friendly tables and seats, such as height-adjustable tables
- Ensuring adequate space between seats to accommodate baby chairs or prams
- Offering family restrooms equipped with child-sized sanitary facilities
- Creating a designated area for children with toys

Workplaces can also promote family-friendly measures to help employees balance work and family responsibilities. Examples include:

- Flexible work arrangements (e.g., flexible working hours, remote work)
- Special leave policies to meet employees' family needs (e.g., parental leave, emergency family leave)
- Provide caring support for employees (e.g., child care service or allowing employees to bring children to work when necessary)
